ORANGE SHIRT DAY The Department of Education will honor the children who attended Indian residential schools by recognizing **Orange Shirt Day on** <u>Friday September 29, 2017</u>. Orange Shirt Day grew out of a story told by a former Indian residential school student at the St. Joseph Mission residential

school commemoration event in Williams Lake, BC, in 2013. As a 6 year old child, on her first day of school at the Mission, Phyllis (Jack) Webstad had all of her clothes taken away, including her shiny new orange shirt, bought by her granny. She didn't understand, and she never saw her shirt again. *Phyllis' story*. Orange Shirt Day has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually. The date was chosen because it is the time of year when children were taken from their homes to residential schools. Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come. Actions of reconciliation may be small, everyday acts that average Canadians can undertake, but others are more provocative that encourage people to think about Indigenous-settler relationships in new ways. 150 Acts of Reconciliation was created for the last 150 days of 2017.
